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PRE-OPERATIVE INSTRUCTIONS

2 weeks prior to surgery

- Stop taking aspirin, NSAIDs (ibuprofen, Advil, Aleve, naproxen), and Vitamin E.
- Stop smoking!

Day before surgery

- Do not eat or drink anything after midnight the night before surgery. This includes water. Be sure to eat a light dinner the night before (not too heavy or spicy). Do not have breakfast.
- A blocked number might call you the night before the surgery. Please try to pick up, it's our anesthesiologist calling to go over details about your care.

How to prep for day of surgery

- Leave jewelry and other valuables at home.
- Anything metal in/on your body can lead to electrical burns and/or infection. Please remove ALL rings, earrings, bracelets, etc. Please also let us know if you have any metal INSIDE your body.
- Bring or wear loose fitting clothing for after surgery. The top should zip in the front (if possible) to facilitate easy dressing/undressing. Sweatpants or pajama pants are great. Wear older clothes in case anything should get soiled postoperatively.
- Bring or wear shoes that are easy to put on, such as slides, Crocs, etc. Try to avoid laces, buckles, or heels
- If you are having liposuction as part of your procedure, please prepare towels or Chux pads in the car to soak up any drainage and avoid staining your car seats.
- Have a friend or loved one ready to pick you up after your surgery. You will also need a responsible adult to stay with you for at least the first 24 hours.
- Recommended supplies to have at home: gauze/maxi pads, medical tape, disposable Chux pads. These items are readily available at any pharmacy.

For out-of town patients

• If you live more than 45 minutes away from our office, please make accommodations to stay in town for at least the night of your procedure. Here (https://www.sutterhealth.org/for-patients/hotels-nearby-cpmc) is a list of hotels that have discounted rates with our office building.

Day of Surgery!

• Please arrive to our office (2100 Webster Street, Suite 429) the day of your procedure at 7 am, unless otherwise instructed. The security guard typically unlocks the front doors of the building and the parking garage at around 6:50 am. Masks are required for entry at this time.
